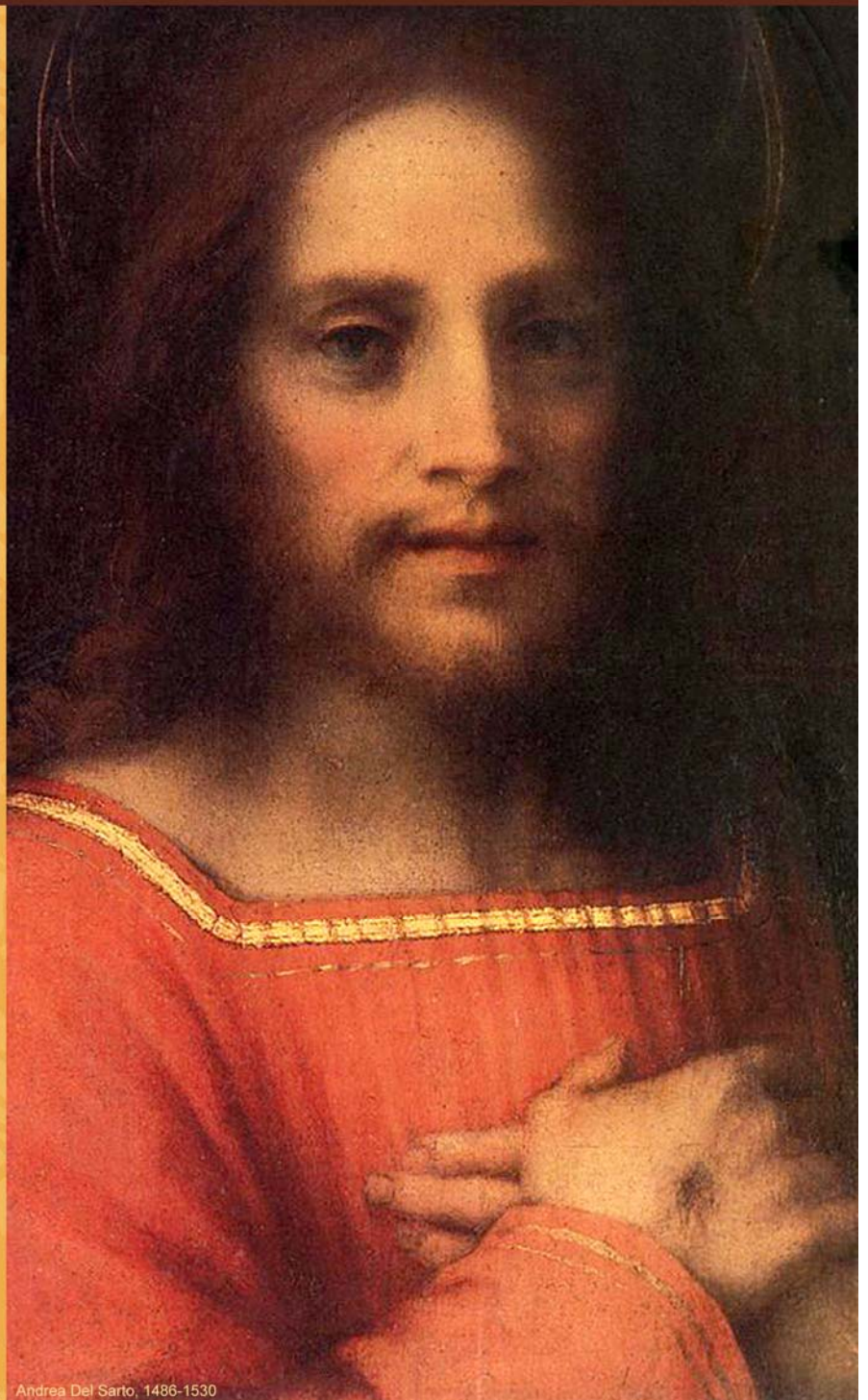

### This is No Time to Take a Vacation from Your Vocation!

This weekend our diocese will have the honor and privilege of ordaining two new priests and one new deacon to serve God and the people of the Rockford Diocese.

Even though it is the time of year that our minds are turning to the those “lazy, hazy, crazy days of summer”: planning for our vacation time, counting the days until school is out, preparing for graduations and other summer relaxation, we must also remind ourselves that this is **no time to take a vacation from our vocation!**

Our Holy Father, Pope Benedict XVI, reminded us in his Message for the 43rd World Day of Prayer for Vocations: *Within the framework of this universal call, Christ, the High Priest, in his solicitude for the Church calls persons in every generation who are to care for his people. In particular, he calls to the ministerial priesthood men who are to exercise a fatherly role, the source of which is within the very fatherhood of God (cfr Eph 3,14). The mission of the priest in the Church is irreplaceable. Therefore, even if in some regions there is a scarcity of clergy, it should never be doubted that Christ continues to raise up men who, like the Apostles, leaving behind all other work, dedicate themselves completely to the celebration of the sacred mysteries, to the preaching of the Gospel and to pastoral ministry.*

In today’s Gospel Jesus reminds His disciples: *As the Father loves me, so I also love you. Remain in my love. (St. John 15: 9)* With love for Jesus and in special recognition of the men who accept His call to priesthood, this year from June 19th (the Feast of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus) through June 18th of 2010, at our Holy Father’s request, we will be celebrating “The Year of the Priest.” There are many plans being made for ways in which we can honor the many priests who have served us faithfully and those special priests who have touched our lives and brought us closer to Jesus. I will be telling you more about this in week’s to come.

Our Lord is continually calling workers into His vineyard. Could He be calling you?

**Now is not the time to take a vacation from your vocation**—no matter who you may be I urge you to make it your occupation to daily pray:

- † that our young people will listen and discern God’s plan for their lives
- † that our dedicated priests and all those in religious life might have the strength and love to be faithful to their vocations and
- † that we might all strengthen our spiritual muscles through prayer, penance and pious practice.

I urge you to pray the following daily:

**Rockford Diocese Vocation Prayer**  
Almighty and Loving God, you speak to us in many ways and soften the heart to hear your call. As your heart speaks to our heart, and the prayer from our lips to your ears is heard, awaken in the young people of our diocese a desire to serve you as a priest, sister or brother. Enter their hearts and minds so they will be open to your call. Christ the Son, you gave your life that we might live. Encourage more men and women to respond to your call. Bless them with homes that are loving, families that are supportive, and churches which are beacons of hope. Keep them steadfast in their love for you and your people. Holy Spirit, Comforter and Guide, strengthen those who now serve your Church. Enkindle in them the fire of your love. Fill them with enthusiasm and zeal. Through their service and witness let young people be drawn to you. Through Your Holy guidance set young hearts on fire; willing to love, willing to serve, willing to be priests, sisters and brothers. We ask this special prayer through the one God in Three Persons; Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Amen.

### Prayer for Priests

O, Jesus, I pray for your faithful and fervent priests; for your unfaithful and tepid priests; for your priests laboring at home and abroad in distant mission fields; for your tempted priests; for your lonely and desolate priests; for your young priests; for your dying priests. But above all I recommend to you the priests dearest to me; the priest who baptized me; the priests who absolved me; the priests at whose Masses I assisted and who gave me your Body and Blood in Holy Communion; the priests who taught and instructed me; all the priests to whom I am indebted in any other way. O Jesus, keep them all close to your heart, and bless them abundantly in time and in eternity. Amen.

### Act of Faith

O my God, I firmly believe that you are one God in three divine Persons, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. I believe that your divine Son became man and died for our sins and that he will come to judge the living and the dead. I believe these and all the truths which the Holy Catholic Church teaches because you have revealed them who are eternal truth and wisdom, who can neither deceive nor be deceived. In this faith I intend to live and die. Amen.

### Act of Hope

O my God, relying on Your almighty power and infinite mercy and promises, I hope to obtain pardon of my sins, the help of Your grace, and life everlasting through the merits of Jesus Christ, my Lord and Redeemer. Amen.

### Act of Love

O my God, I love You above all things, with my whole heart and soul, because You are all good and worthy of all love. I love my neighbor as myself for the love of You. I forgive all who have injured me, and ask pardon of all who I have injured. Amen.
