Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

POINTS TO PONDER

From our Pastor—Fr. Sabo

This is my Body...this is my Blood.
St. Mark 14:22-23

What is the one thing as Catholics we could not contemplate living without? Philosophers would respond by pointing out that the majority of lads live in discrete desperation, thirsting for the touch of love. Pious pilgrims would proclaim: *Lo! The angel's food is given to the pilgrim who has striven; see the children's bread from heaven, which on dogs may not be spent. Truth the ancient types fulfilling, Isaac bound, a victim willing, Paschal lamb, its lifeblood spilling, Manna to the fathers sent (sequence for Corpus Christi).* Today we celebrate this great Solemnity in honor of the mystery of **the Most Blessed**

Sacrament: *the source and summit of our Catholic Faith. (Catechism of the Catholic Church, #1324).* In the Most Blessed Sacrament we receive our greatest reward: ***those who are called may receive the promised eternal inheritance*** (Hebrews 9:15). How do we get the most grace out of this—the Greatest of all Sacraments? We need to ***appreciate*** the Eucharist more fully, ***receive*** it more fruitfully, and ***share*** it more effectively (Beginning Apologetics, Volume 3: Fr. Chacon & Jim Burnham).

In the first reading taken from the Book of Exodus, Moses acts as a mediator of a covenant between the people of Israel and the Lord our God. How did they respond to this intervention by God? They all answered with one voice: ***We will do everything that the Lord has told us*** (Exodus 24:3). What is the first thing we discover in celebrating this Solemnity in honor of the mystery of the Most Blessed Sacrament? Do we do everything that Christ our Lord has told us about His Real Presence in the Holy Eucharist? As Jesus

says in St. John's Gospel: ***Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in Him*** (6:56). Would most Christians be content with a picture of the person they claim to love, giving them an occasional glance or perhaps a private audience and personal affection? This is one reason why Catholic Churches keep the red candle burning near the tabernacle as an invitation to intimacy with Christ Jesus, who transforms everyone who is touched by the Truth. ***He is mediator of a new covenant: since a death has taken place for deliverance from transgressions under the first covenant, those who are called may receive the promised eternal inheritance*** (Hebrews 9:15). By discovering the Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Christ concealed in the appearance of the Sacred Host, we find the perfect way to ***appreciate the Eucharist more fully!***

What do we need to do to receive Him more fruitfully? Our Early Church Fathers offer compelling testimony to the Truth regarding the Real Presence of Christ in the Holy Eucharist: Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity. St. Ignatius of Antioch, a disciple of St. John around the year 110 A.D., stated: *I have no taste for corruptible food or for the pleasures of this life. I desire the Flesh of Jesus Christ, who was of the seed of David; and for drink I desire His Blood, which is love incorruptible.* Though we love to smell the aroma inspiring us to barbeque our favorite carnage cooking on a gas grill, how about the invitation that comes from smelling blessed incense: *Venite Adoramus* (i.e., Come let us adore Him)! Around 150 A.D., St. Justin writes: *We call this food Eucharist; and no one is permitted to partake of it, except one who believes our teaching is true...the change of which our blood and flesh is nourished, is both the Flesh and Blood of that incarnated Jesus.* To get the most grace out of each and every reception of Holy Communion requires the following:

- the person must be a baptized Catholic,
- be without any mortal sin on their soul since their last confession, and
- fast for at least one hour before receiving the Most Blessed Sacrament.

This means abstaining from any food or drink (including gum, with the exception of drinking water with medicine). The Holy Eucharist helps us to imitate Christ Jesus: ***who through the eternal Spirit offered Himself unblemished to God, to cleanse our consciences from dead works to worship the living God*** (Hebrews 9:14).

The Last way that we receive the most graces from the Greatest of Sacraments, so as to communicate His charity more concretely to others is perhaps our greatest challenge. How do we share the grace of the Holy Eucharist more effectively: with our children, with our co-workers and with our combatants? St. Thomas Aquinas refers to the Most Blessed Sacrament as the *Sacrament of Church unity*. Thanks to our attendance at Eucharistic Adoration, Eucharistic processions and Holy Sacrifices of the Mass, we cause unbelievers to wonder for the reason for our amazing worship! To reach out to those who believe that they can live without the grace of the Holy Eucharist, begin by relying on the inspiration of the Holy Spirit, who helps us know the perfect time to invite others to: ***come and see, the goodness of the Lord!*** Bring a friend any Tuesday evening to Family Adoration and find out the reason why Catholics can sing! St. John's Gospel reminds us of the promise made by Jesus, something worth reminding those who forget why God created us in His image and likeness: ***he who eats my Flesh and drinks my Blood has eternal life, and I will raise him up on the last day*** (6:54). Since the Blessed Sacrament stays in our bodies for approximately fifteen minutes, perhaps the time after receiving Holy Communion is best spent doing the following:

- † return silently to your pew,
- † avoid unnecessary chatter, bathroom breaks, putting gum or mints in your mouth
- † remind yourself of the true treasure contained in the Truth: ***This is my Body ... this is my Blood, which will be shed for many*** (St. Mark 14:22-23).

Before daring to draw close to the Most Blessed Sacrament, we lift up our hearts and pray the Angel Fatima prayer disclosed to the children in 1916:



Most Holy Trinity, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, I adore Thee profoundly. I offer Thee the Most Precious Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Jesus Christ, present in all the tabernacles of the world, in reparation for the outrages,

sacrileges, and indifference by which He is offended. And through the infinite merit of His Most Sacred Heart, and the Immaculate Heart of Mary, I beg of Thee the conversion of poor sinners. Our Lady of Fatima: pray for us! Amen.

Baptisms take place by appointment. Meet with Father Sabo at least three months before making any other arrangements 815-653-2561

1st Confession-1st Holy Communion or Confirmation: Contact Father Sabo at the Parish Office 815-653-2561.

Marriage: Preparation for Catholic wedding ceremony in the Diocese of Rockford takes place in steps over a period of at least 6 months. Therefore, meet with Father Sabo at least 6 months before making any other arrangements such as flowers, reception etc.
