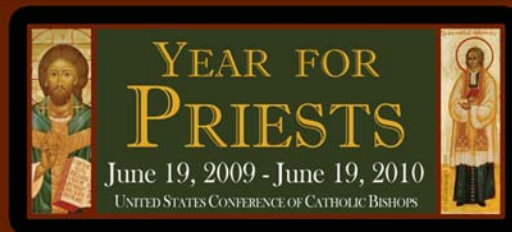

POINTS TO PONDER

From our Pastor—Fr. Sabo

In Him we have redemption by His blood, the forgiveness of transgressions, in accord with the riches of His grace that He lavished upon us. Ephesians 1:6

The entire month of July is dedicated to the Most Precious Blood of Jesus. How often do we invoke the protection of *the Blood of the Lamb of God* to avoid the near occasions of sin? To win the battle against sin, sickness and sadness, say the following: *I claim the protection of the Blood of the Lamb of God. Amen.* Every time we place our fingers in the Holy Water Font we should pray the following: *by the Blood of Jesus and by this Holy Water may I be cleansed of all my sins* (while making the sign of the cross on your flesh). In the words of Blessed John XXIII *the Blood of Christ is the price of our redemption, the pledge of salvation and eternal life* (1960). As indicated in the *Catechism of the Catholic Church*: *the sign of the cross marks with the imprint of Christ the one who is going to belong to Him and signifies the grace of redemption Christ won for us by His cross* (#1235).

To grasp the grace of salvation, we need to meditate on the mystery of our salvation, not only on the wood of the cross, but **the Wounds of Christ**: His bruised, broken and battered Body, as well as His Precious Blood, *the Blood of the new and everlasting covenant which is shed for all so that sins may be forgiven* (St. Matthew 26:27). *How could we ever fail to recognize the value of every human being, when Christ shed His Blood for each one without distinction* (Pope JPII: Address given July 1, 2000) The Passion of the Christ is the price our King was willing to pay for our pardon and

peace, hence the meaning of St. Paul's words: ***In Him we have redemption by His Blood.***

As Catholics it is incomprehensible to contemplate the love of God without first contemplating a Blood-Stained Cross! The Crucifix is the consummation of human and Divine Love made available to those in need of God's grace and mercy! When was the last time you recognized a reference to *blood*, while reading the Bible? There are approximately four hundred and forty references in Sacred Scripture to blood of various animals, people, the lamb of God and Blood of Christ, to name a few. In the Hebrew Scriptures (i.e., Old Testament) there are about three hundred and thirty-nine total references, while the New Testament mentions blood about one hundred times. Clearly the Prophet Ezekiel and St. Paul make the most references to **the blood**: (50) and (35) respectively. What is this much to do about **the blood**? It beckons every believer to be strong in the threat of temptation and reminds us of the necessity of baptism for the sake of salvation, being **sealed with the promised Holy Spirit, which is the first installment of our inheritance toward redemption as God's possession, to the praise of His glory** (Ephesians, 1:14). Furthermore, St. Paul points to the possibility of pardon for even the most pitiable of sinners by proclaiming: ***In Him we have redemption by His Blood, the forgiveness of transgressions*** (Eph. 1:6). Contrary to what our culture and media would like us to believe: our greatest freedom is not dependent upon our own fame or fortune, but rather to our faith: the revelation of **the riches---**Christ's Body & Blood!

In order to appreciate the mystery of Christ's Passion, the sacrifice of His Body and shedding of His Precious Blood, we need to profit from our piety. Most recently, on February 22 (Feast of the Chair of St. Peter), in the year 1931: Jesus appeared to a Polish Nun, Sister Faustina, in a vision and expressed His desire that an image be painted with the signature, ***Jesus I Trust in You***. From His pierced Heart, not visible in the image, two rays issue forth. Jesus explained that the pale rays represent the *Water that makes souls righteous* and the red rays represent the *Blood that is the life of souls* (Diary of St. Faustina, #299). The traditional hour dedicated to honoring the Passion of Christ is called the *Hour of Mercy* (3:00 p.m.). Every day someone is dying and in need of our prayers, why not pick-up your rosary and pray the Divine Mercy Chaplet or Rosary for some

unknown sinner in need of the *protection of the Blood of the Lamb of God!* In 1935 our Blessed Lord dictated the following prayer to St. Faustina: *Eternal Father I offer Thee the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Your dearly beloved Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, in atonement for our sins and the sins of the whole world* (this prayer is said on the five single beads of the chaplet). For each of the ten smaller beads, pray the following: *For the sake of His sorrowful Passion, have mercy on us and on the whole world.* At the end of the chaplet, repeat the following prayer (three times): *Holy God, Holy Mighty One, Holy Immortal One, have mercy on us and on the whole world.* The Divine Mercy Chaplet is said every Tuesday Evening here at our parish during Family Adoration from 7-8 p.m. *The Chaplet is a very powerful prayer for the dying, for the conversion of sinners, to obtain special graces, to appease God's anger, to avert natural disasters, as well as dispel the attacks of the evil one* (Bishop Emilio S. Allue, S.D.B., 1996). Thus we discover the wealth of the words: ***In Him we have redemption by His Blood ... in accord with the riches of His grace that he lavished upon us*** (Ephesians 1:6).

During this year dedicated to the sanctification of priests, we need to increase the profitability of our prayers by protecting ourselves from the harassment of hell: temptations to sin, the molestations of the demons, as well as the lies and deceptions of the devil, by making recourse to the Precious Blood of Jesus. Thus we pray:

O Precious Blood of our salvation, we believe, we hope and trust in You. Deliver all those that are in the hands of the infernal spirits we beseech You. Protect the dying against the works of evil spirits and welcome them into Your eternal glory. Have mercy on the whole world and strengthen us to worship and console the Sacred Heart. We adore you, O Precious Blood of mercy.

O Mary conceived without sin: pray for us who have recourse to thee. Amen.

WORD OF LIFE
