POINTS TO PONDER

From our Holy Father
Pope Benedict XVI

Caritas in Veritate (Charity in Truth)

On June 29, 2009 Pope Benedict XVI released his third encyclical [letter] entitled *Caritas in Veritate*. An extended title on the document reads: *to the Bishops, Priests, Deacons, Men and Women Religious, the Lay Faithful, and All People of Good Will on the Integral Human Development in Charity and Truth*. As with all papal encyclicals, the title of the letter is based upon the first words of that letter. Pope Benedict begins this letter with the sentence: *Charity in truth, to which Jesus Christ bore witness by his earthly life and especially by his death and resurrection, is the principal driving force behind the authentic development of every person and of all humanity*. To whet your appetite for all that the Holy Father has to say, we are presenting this small sampling of sentences found among the 79 paragraphs of the letter.

1. Love—caritas—is an extraordinary force which leads people to opt for courageous and generous engagement in the field of justice and peace. It is a force that has its origin in God, Eternal Love and Absolute Truth.

2. Charity is at the heart of the Church's social doctrine.

3. Only in truth does charity shine forth, only in truth can charity be authentically lived.

4. Because it is filled with truth, charity can be understood in the abundance of its values, it can be shared and communicated.

5. Charity is love received and given. It is "grace" (charis).

6. "*Caritas in veritate*" is the principle around which the Church's social doctrine

turns, a principle that takes on practical form in the criteria that govern moral action. I would like to consider two of these in particular, of special relevance to the commitment to development in an increasingly globalized society: justice and the common good...Charity goes beyond justice,...justice is inseparable from charity.

7. Another important consideration is the common good. To love someone is to desire that person's good and to take effective steps to secure it.

8. In 1967, when he issued the encyclical *Populorum Progressio*, my venerable predecessor Pope Paul VI illuminated the great theme of the development of peoples with the splendor of truth and the gentle light of Christ's charity.

9. The risk of our time is that the de facto interdependence of people and nations is not matched by ethical interaction of consciences and minds that would give rise to truly human development.

16. In *Populorum Progressio*, Paul VI taught that progress, in its origin and essence, is first and foremost a vocation.

17. A vocation is a call that requires a free and responsible answer. Integral human development presupposes the responsible freedom of the individual and of peoples: no structure can guarantee this development over and above human responsibility.

20. It is Christ's charity that drives us on....The urgency is inscribed not only in things, it is not derived solely from the rapid succession of events and problems, but also from the very matter that is at stake: the establishment of authentic fraternity.

23. ...it should be stressed that progress of a merely economic and technological kind is insufficient. Development needs above all to be true and integral.

27. Feed the hungry (cf Mt 25:35,37,42) is an ethical imperative for the universal Church, as she responds to the teachings of her Founder, the Lord Jesus, concerning solidarity and the sharing of goods.

28. One of the most striking aspects of development in the present day is the important question of respect for life, which cannot in any way be detached from questions concerning the development of peoples.

29. Violence puts the brakes on authentic development and impedes the evolution of peoples towards greater socio-economic and spiritual well-being.

31. ...moral evaluation and scientific

research must go hand in hand, and ...charity must animate them in a harmonious interdisciplinary whole, marked by unity and distinction.

34. Sometimes modern man is wrongly convinced that he is the sole author of himself, his life and society. This is a presumption that follows from being selfishly closed in upon himself, and it is a consequence—to express it in faith terms—of original sin.

40. Today's international economic scene, marked by grave deviations and failures, requires a profoundly new way of understanding business enterprise. Old models are disappearing, but promising new ones are taking shape on the horizon.

43. Many people today would claim that they owe nothing to anyone, except to themselves. They are concerned only with their rights, and they often have great difficulty in taking responsibility for their own and other people's integral development. Hence it is important to call for a renewed reflection on how rights presuppose duties, if they are not to become mere license.

51. The way humanity treats the environment influences the way it treats itself, and vice versa. This invites contemporary society to a serious review of its life-style, which, in many parts of the world, is prone to hedonism and consumerism, regardless of their harmful consequences.

53. If we look closely at other kinds of poverty, including material forms, we see that they are born from isolation, from not being loved or from difficulties in being able to love.

57. Fruitful dialogue between faith and reason cannot but render the work of charity more effective within society, and it constitutes the most appropriate framework for promoting fraternal collaboration between believers and non-believers in their shared commitment to working for justice and the peace of the human family.

78. As we contemplate the vast amount of work to be done, we are sustained by our faith that God is present alongside those who come together in his name to work for justice.

79. May the Virgin Mary—proclaimed Mater Ecclesiae (Mother of the Church) by Paul VI...protect us and obtain for us...the strength, hope and joy necessary to continue to dedicate ourselves with generosity to the task of bringing about the *development of the whole man and all men* (*Populorum Progressio*, 42).

Baptisms take place by appointment. Meet with Father Sabo at least three months before making any other arrangements 815-653-2561

1st Confession-1st Holy Communion or Confirmation: Contact Father Sabo at the Parish Office 815-653-2561.

Marriage: Preparation for Catholic wedding ceremony in the Diocese of Rockford takes place in steps over a period of at least 6 months. Therefore, meet with Father Sabo at least 6 months before making any other arrangements such as flowers, reception etc.

Anointing of the Sick is a sacrament of healing and comfort. Call the parish office as soon as someone becomes ill. Also, for chronic illnesses, this sacrament is offered twice a year. Watch the bulletin or call the parish office 815-653-2561 for more information.
