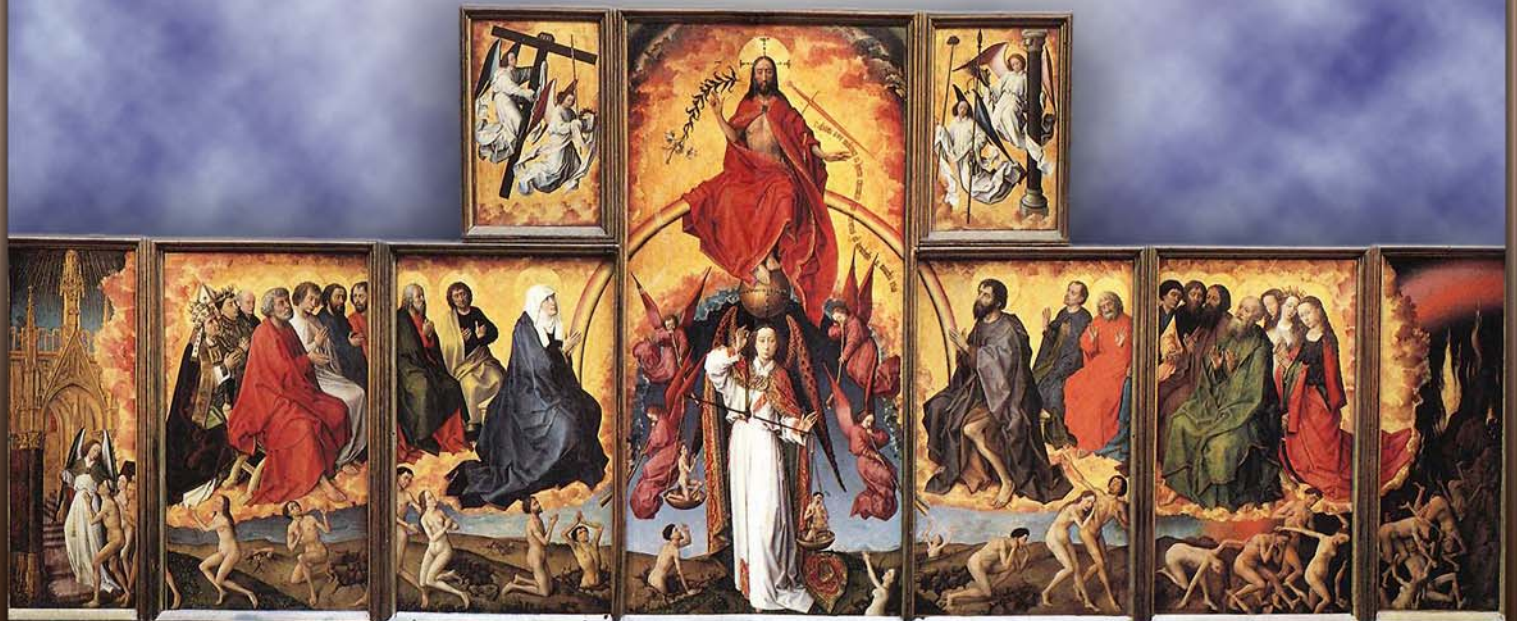

POINTS TO PONDER

From our Pastor—Father Sabo

Celebrate All Saints & All Souls

I came down from heaven not to do my own will but the will of the one who sent me.

St. John 6:37

The response of those who follow Christ is ... to take the path chosen by the One who, in the face of the evils of his time and of all times, embraced the Cross with determination....

Following in His footsteps and united to Him,

we must all strive to oppose evil with good,

falsehood with truth, hatred with love (Pope Benedict XVI).

God has created us to be saints. This is why the Catholic Church celebrates every November 1st, ***the Feast of All Saints***, as well as November 2nd, ***All Souls***. We thank Jesus for their intercession - the *Great Cloud of Witnesses*: consecrated men and women, single and chaste men and women, widows, widowers, virgins, martyrs, priests, religious, monks, brothers, sisters, hermits, monks, married men and women and the millions of holy innocents! In our daily efforts towards that end we find within ourselves various attitudes and intentions that are at odds with arriving at our goal, heaven and its prerequisite, being in a state of grace. To celebrate *the Saints* and pray for *the Poor Souls* is a source of happiness here on earth and our hope for heaven. To make the most of this month dedicated to the Poor Souls in Purgatory, we need the following three steps to grow daily in response to the sanctifying grace of God:

A. strive to ***oppose evil with good***;

B. strive to ***oppose falsehood with Truth***;

C. strive to ***oppose hatred with love***

taken from Pope Benedict's homily at the Basilica of St. Sabina on the Aventine Hill, March 1, 2006.

We must all strive to oppose evil with good.

Many Christians strive for a form of goodness that is actually spiritual laziness a.k.a. being lukewarm. They do not disobey the commandments, but neither do their lives change in conformity to Christ, His cause and His crown—***God proves His love for us in that while we were still sinners Christ died for us. How much more then, since we are now***

justified by His Blood, we will be saved through him from the wrath (Romans, 6:6-7).

For those who joylessly journey along with Jesus in this valley of tears, each confession is basically a repetition of every other confession. Each day's trial brings on more frustrations. Each and every headache leads to a repetition of resentments and new forms of fury. *For many Christians prayer is directed at God rather than to God. Christianity becomes solely a religion and a vehicle by which they calm their consciences or petition the Supreme Being for daily needs* (Mother Angelica). There is a separation—a great gulf between themselves and the *Father of Mercies*. It is almost like a great chasm over which one shouts for help in the hope that an invisible hero on the other side might be listening and come to their rescue without a preference for *the Providence of God*.

However, as St. Paul tells us in the second reading on All Souls' Day from his letter to the Romans: ***Hope does not disappoint, because the love of God has been poured out into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us (6:3).***

Striving to oppose evil with good means we honor God's laws—the Ten Commandments, (i.e., do not support businesses that promote policies or principles that are intrinsically evil, for example hotel chains that offer on demand adult movies, campaigns to remove Godly programming from TV broadcasts [Petition 2493 to the FCC], any threats to life at any and all stages, federal funds used to promote abortion or euthanasia disguised as “universal health care.”)

We must strive to oppose falsehood with truth.

Too many of us live our entire lives in one of two extremes, the first being a kind of spiritual Utopia—a dream world of porous promises, duplicitous discipleship and sugar-coated struggles. On the other extreme there are many battle-weary believers who become *spiritual gluttons*, prone to pursue every opportunity for grace without making the most of opportunities to inspire in others, a heroic obedience to authentic authority. We put up smoke screens for our sins and rationalize them to the point where we owe neither God nor our neighbor any repentance, honor or gratitude. What can be said of one Saint can be said of every Saint – *they were no friend of falsehood!* There are four degrees of falsehood: incredulity, heresy, apostasy and schism. In the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* (#2089), we discover the difference: *incredulity is the neglect of revealed truth or the willful refusal to assent to it. Heresy is the obstinate post-baptismal denial of some truth which must be believed with divine and catholic faith; apostasy is the total repudiation of the Christian faith; schism is the refusal of*

*submission to the Roman Pontiff or of communion with the members of the Church subjected to him. The Truth that continues to transform everything He touches is manifested by the God-Man who exclaimed: **this is the will of the one who sent me, that I should not lose anything of what he gave me, but that I should raise it on the last day** (St. John 6:38).*

We must all strive to oppose hatred with love.

One of the Saints who stood speechless at the foot of the Cross would later proclaim in His Gospel: Jesus said to the crowds: ***everyone who sees the Son and believes in Him may have eternal life, and I shall raise him on the last day*** (St. John 6:40). Do not be deceived, there is nothing more profitable than a personal relationship with Christ. Unfortunately, for those who only give God a passing glance, His Will becomes so obscure that a dense fog is like a clear day in comparison with what He wants and what we think He wants. At this stage we cry out for God's Will in our lives but our preconceived ideas of truth, goodness and beauty, *stand between us and God like a medieval castle wall* (Mother Angelica). We freeze and shiver from the cold of frustrated loneliness, searching for the warmth emanating from the fire of His Holy Will.

At the core of this conflict is our lack of self-knowledge - that acts like a ball and chain that barely give us room to move in closer to ***the Fire of Divine Love***. Our desires to be better keep us from freezing to death, but our lack of courage to see ourselves as we are, plants our roots securely in the land of *porous promises and sugar-coated struggles*. We stand still: afraid of what we have become - sinners, desperate to be better, but petrified at the sacrifices to be made in order to become ***SAINTS!*** A glorious future awaits those of us who accept the invitation to eternal life, that comes to us from our *German Shepherd*, Pope Benedict XVI: ***take the path chosen by the One who, in the face of the evils of His time and of all times, embraced the Cross with determination ... Following in His footsteps and united to Him, we must all strive to oppose evil with good, falsehood with truth, and hatred with love*** (March 1, 2006).

Jesus is the supreme satisfaction for those of us interested in becoming ***SAINTS!*** Joining our prayers to Mary, the *Gate of Heaven*, we offer the prayer composed by St. Gertrude the Great for the Poor Souls in Purgatory:

*Eternal Father: I offer Thee
the Most Precious Blood of*

*Thy Divine Son, Jesus: in union with
the Masses said throughout the world
today; for all the holy souls in
purgatory, for sinners everywhere; for
sinners in the Universal Church, those
in my own home and within my family.*

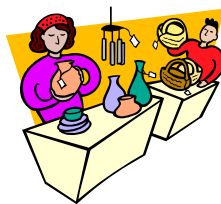

All the members of the St Vincent de Paul Society wish to thank those parishioners who have given so generously over the last year. Your charity is great and undeniable. I believe that your greatest reward is not these words of appreciation, but what our Lord has in store for you in heaven.

I thought you might like to know how your donations have been used during the past year. First of all, our parish of only 400 families has contributed through the monthly envelopes, boxes in the back of the church and special collections a total of \$26,295.

We served 349 people, most of whom we visited in their homes. We helped with housing in the amount of \$8,273, heat - \$4,542, electricity - \$6,431, water - \$587, auto - \$3,009, food - \$1,973 and other miscellaneous items.

It's wonderful to be part of this activity. We are always looking for good people to join our ranks and help out. Please pray about this and let us know if you would like to help. We meet on the second and fourth Saturday of the month at 8:30 am right after the 8:00 am mass. The meeting usually lasts for about two hours.

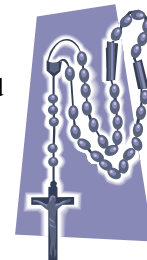
