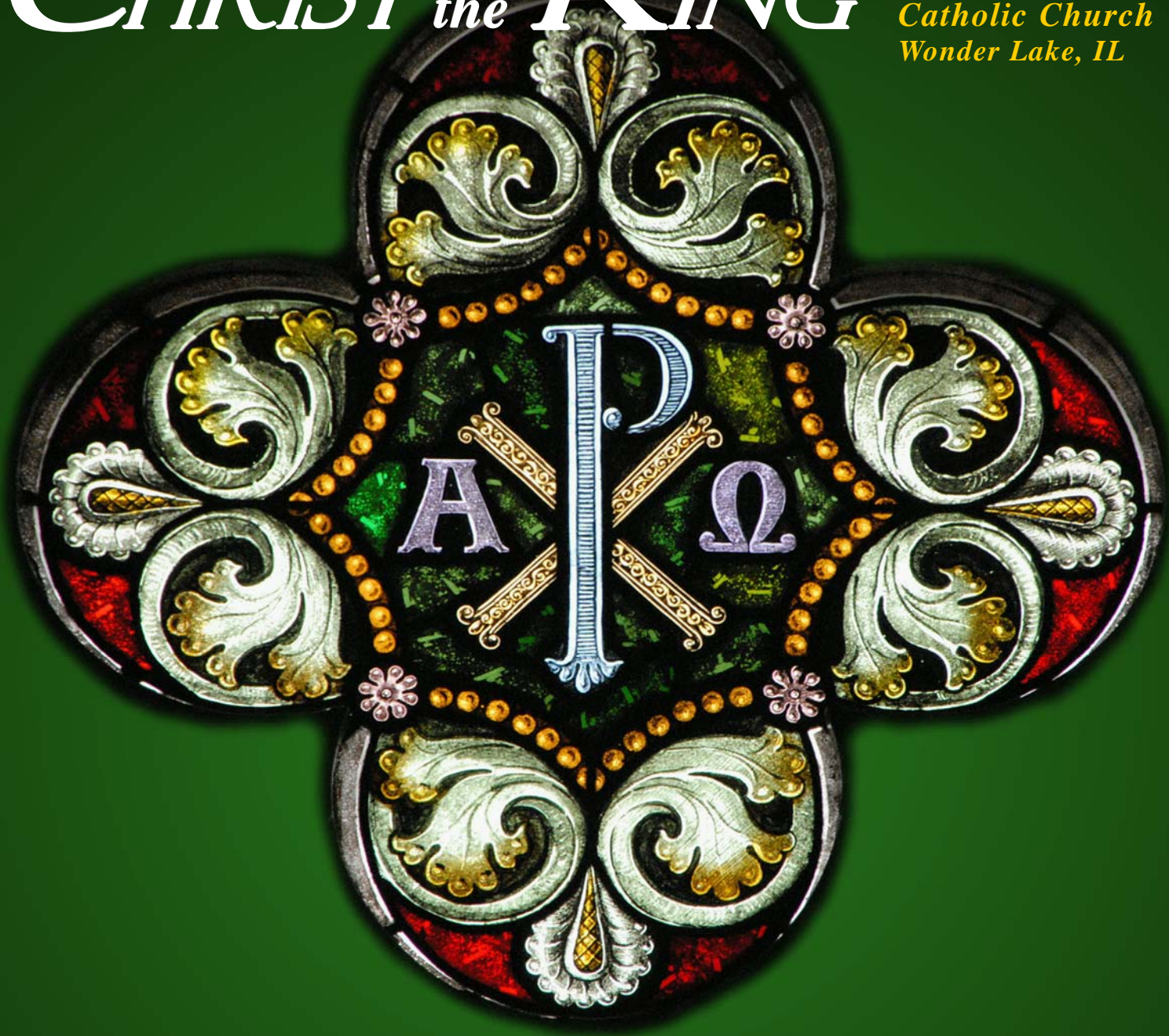

POINTS TO PONDER

From our Pastor—Fr. Sabo

Love never fails.

1 Corinthians, 13:9

With a perilous prognosis and his little sister listening outside the door as the doctor told him that he didn't have much time to live, she went promptly to the hospital chapel and pleaded with Jesus in the tabernacle. Her lively faith and heavenly hope enabled her to realize the tremendous good her brother could accomplish if God healed her brother, so he could finish his seminary training and be ordained a priest. As the family rejoiced over the miraculous healing of their son and his return to the seminary, they would all experience the truth of St. Paul's words: ***Love never fails.*** Motivated by such love, his little sister would teach them the hardest lesson of all, as it relates to fulfilling God's plan: ***Today this Scripture passage is fulfilled in your hearing*** (St. Luke 4:21).

Perhaps, those persons who love without limit are the most prone to suffer in solidarity with those who are most dear to them. Devastated by the rapid decline in her health, the newly ordained priest stood by the bedside of his little sister who began to move her lips, as if to speak her final testament. Barely audible, she simply whispered, *I did it for you, I asked Jesus to spare your life in exchange for my own.* There was no suitable response for such a gesture of love than to realize the fullest sense of the truth that: ***Love: bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things, (1 Corinthians, 13:4ff).***

The Prophet Jeremiah encourages us in the first reading: *They will fight against you but not prevail over you, for I am with you to deliver you, says the Lord (1:4-4, 17-19).* There are three enemies that operate in such a way so as to challenge charity, namely: the flesh, the world, and the devil. In response to all three threats to charity (a theological virtue that is "superior to all the virtues,") we must pray and persevere that God grant us the strength and grace to approach every conflict mindful of the wisdom present in the Second Reading: being kind, no matter how out of line the other person become, not jealous, pompous, inflated or rude, thus not seeking its own interests, becoming quick-tempered, brooding over injury, rejoicing over wrongdoing, but rather rejoicing over the truth. These are guidelines for what I would like to label, *Rules for Fair Fighting*, and a reminder of the truth, that ***Love never fails.***

Today's readings are a subtle guideline for anyone prone to disagreements, debates, and dislikes. No one is entitled to destructive, demeaning or disrespectful dialogue. I am shocked by the number of people who act as though unaware of the deadly threat of the tongue, subject to the evil influence of anger, jealousy or pride. The Apostle Paul has given an incomparable depiction of Divine Love by declaring: *There is no limit to love's forbearance, to its trust, its hope, its power to endure. Love never fails.*

The best example of this kind of love in action is illustrated by Jesus, who not only spoke the Word of Truth, suffered for sake of the Truth, and indeed is the Truth. After the people heard Him speak, *they rose up, drove him out of the town, and led him to the brow of the hill on which their town had been build, to hurl him down headlong. (St. Luke, 4:29-30).* Thus we learn from Jesus that despite the crowd's evil intention: *love is not to be confused with sentimentality or mere good fellowship, nor with that*

somewhat questionable zeal to help others in order to convince ourselves of our superiority. Rather, it means living in peace with our neighbor, and doing all we can to get others to contemplate that image, so that they too may learn how to turn to Christ in their every crisis (St. Jose-Maria Escriva). They will fight against you, but not prevail over you, for I am with you to deliver you, says he Lord (Jeremiah 1:19). Victory comes to those who value, above everything else, the virtue called charity. Hence the meaning of the words: ***Love never fails.***

While the world waits to watch the finest and most fit competitors participate in the Winter Olympics in Vancouver, British Columbia, Canada. All are aware that only a very small percentage will ever be crowned with the gold medal. However, in the spiritual life, the greatest reward is reserved not for the most fit, but rather the most faithful, who are in pursuit of the prize that never perishes, eternal life! May our greatest ally in all of our endeavors for excellence, be our belief that: ***Love never fails!!!*** Furthermore, the lesson to be learned from the little girl who would willingly bear the burden of her brother, is the following as taken from St. Paul's letter to the Corinthians: ***At present I know partially; then I shall know fully, as I am fully known. So faith, hope, and love remain, these three; but the greatest of these is love.***

Here are some great Scripture passages for anyone interested in learning about the various aspects of charity, namely to become someone who *loves and loves without limit!*

Psalm 33:5; Proverbs 15:9; Song of Songs, 3:3; St. Matthew 10:37; St. Luke 7:47; St. John 12:25, 2 Corinthians 9:7; Hebrews 12:6; 1 John 4:7; and the Book of Revelation (i.e., the Apocalypse) 1:5.
