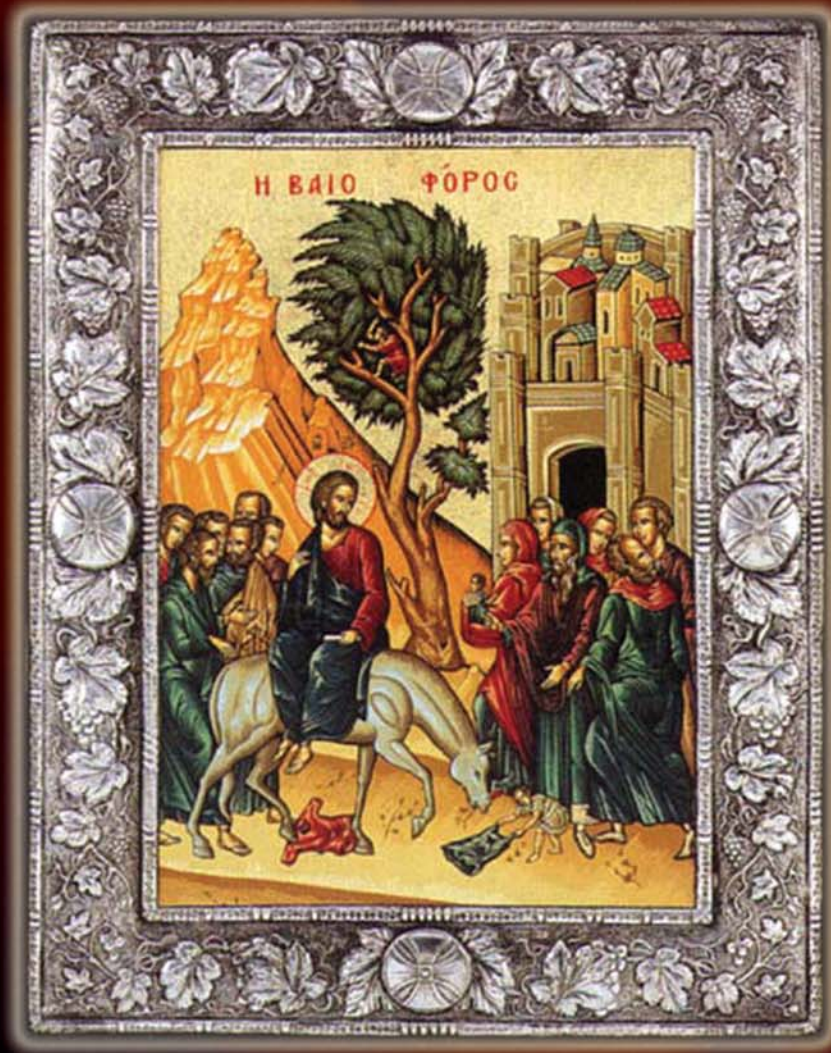

POINTS TO PONDER

From our Pastor—Fr. Sabo

I gave my back to those who beat me, my cheeks to those who plucked my beard; my face I did not shield from buffets and spitting.
Isaiah, 50:6

The Way of Sorrows for every sinner to spiritually travel this Holy Week with our Savior!

Pray the Way of the Cross while holding a crucifix in you hands and kiss the corpus between each station.

Preparatory Prayer: *O most merciful Jesus, with a contrite heart and penitent spirit, I bow down in profound humility before Thy Divine Majesty. I adore Thee as my supreme Lord and Master; I believe in Thee, I hope in Thee, and I love Thee above all things. I am heartily sorry for having offended Thee, my Supreme and Only Good. I resolve to amend my life, and although I am unworthy to obtain mercy, yet the sight of Thy holy cross, on which Thou didst die, inspires me with hope and consolation. I will, therefore, meditate on Thy sufferings, and visit the stations of Thy Passion in company with Thy sorrowful Mother and my guardian angel, with the intention of promoting Thy honor and saving my soul. O merciful Redeemer, who has said, "And I, if I be lifted from earth, will draw all things to myself," draw my heart and my love to Thee, that I may*

perform this devotion as perfectly as possible, and that I may live and die in union with Thee. Amen.

After each station pray the following:
Our Father, Hail Mary, Glory be...

SHORT WAY OF THE CROSS – as used by the Franciscan Fathers

First Station: Jesus is condemned to death – *O Jesus, so meek and mild teach me resignation in times of trial. Lord Jesus crucified, have mercy on me, a sinner!*

Second Station: Jesus carries His Cross – *My Jesus: this Cross should be mine, not Thine! My sins crucified Thee! Lord Jesus crucified, have mercy on me, a sinner!*

Third Station: Our Lord falls for the first time – *O Jesus, by this first fall, never let me fall into mortal sin. Lord Jesus crucified, have mercy on me, a sinner!*

Fourth Station: Jesus meets His Mother – *O Jesus, may no human tie, however dear: keep me from flowing the way of the Cross. Lord Jesus crucified, have mercy on me, a sinner!*

Fifth Station: Simon of Cyrene helps Jesus carry His Cross – *Simon unwillingly assisted Thee; may I with patience suffer all for Thee. Lord Jesus crucified, have mercy on me, a sinner!*

Sixth Station: Veronica wipes the face of Jesus – *O Jesus, Thou didst imprint Thy sacred features upon Veronica's veil; stamp them also indelibly upon my soul! Lord Jesus crucified, have mercy on me, a sinner!*

Seventh Station: Jesus falls the second time – *By Thy second fall, preserve me, dear Lord, from relapse into sin. Lord Jesus crucified, have mercy on me, a sinner!*

Eighth Station: Jesus comforts the Women of Jerusalem – *My greatest consolation would be to hear Thee say: "Many sins are forgiven thee, because thou hast loved much." Lord Jesus crucified, have mercy on me, a sinner!*

Ninth Station: Jesus falls the third time – *O Jesus, when weary upon life's long road, be Thou my strength and my satisfaction! Lord Jesus crucified, have mercy on me, a sinner!*

Tenth Station: Jesus is stripped of His Garments – *My soul has been robbed of its robe of innocence: clothe me, dear Jesus,*

with the garb of penance and perfect contrition. Lord Jesus crucified, have mercy on me, a sinner!

Eleventh Station: Jesus is nailed to the Cross – *Thou didst forgive Thy enemies. My God, grant me Thy Love to forgive injuries and the humility to forget them. Lord Jesus crucified, have mercy on me, a sinner!*

Twelfth Station: Jesus dies on the Cross (Pause for a moment of silence, genuflect, then kiss your Crucifix) – *O most amiable Jesus! How must I regard the world and its vanities, when I behold Thee hanging on the cross, covered with wounds? O Jesus, receive me into Thy wounded Heart: I belong entirely to Thee; for love of Thee alone do I desire to live and die. Lord Jesus crucified, have mercy on me, a sinner!*

Thirteenth Station: Jesus is taken down from the Cross and given to His Mother – *O Lord Jesus Christ, Thy lifeless body: mangled and lacerated, found a worthy resting-place on the bosom of Thy Virgin Mother. Receive me into thy arms, O Sorrowful Mother; and obtain for me perfect contrition for my sins. Lord Jesus crucified, have mercy on me, a sinner!*

Fourteenth Station: Jesus is laid in the Tomb – *When I receive Thee into my heart in Holy Communion, O Jesus, make it a fit dwelling place for Thy adorable Body. Amen. Lord Jesus crucified, have mercy on me, a sinner!*

Concluding Prayer: *Almighty and eternal God, merciful Father, who has given to the human race Thy beloved Son as a example of humility, obedience, and patience, to precede us on the way of life, bearing the cross: graciously grant us that we, inflamed by His infinite love, may take up the sweet yoke of His Gospel together with the mortification of the cross, following Him as His true disciples, so that we shall one day gloriously rise with Him and joyfully hear Him say: "Come, ye blessed of My Father, and possess Thy kingdom which was prepared for you from the beginning," where Thou live and reign with the Son and the Holy Spirit, and where we hope to reign with Thee, world without end. Amen. (Pray for the Holy Father's intentions: Our Father, Hail Mary and Glory Be).*

St. Leo the Great: *Through the cross the faithful receive strength from weakness, glory from dishonor, life from death.*

In the Hospital?

If you or a loved one are in the hospital, please call the parish office 815-653-2561 immediately. Due to privacy laws, the hospitals do not notify us when you are admitted. We want to visit those in the hospital, but need to hear from you.

Baptisms take place by appointment. Meet with Father Sabo at least three months before making any other arrangements 815-653-2561

1st Confession-1st Holy Communion or Confirmation: Contact Father Sabo at the Parish Office 815-653-2561.

Marriage: Preparation for Catholic wedding ceremony in the Diocese of Rockford takes place in steps over a period of at least 6 months. Therefore, meet with Father Sabo at least 6 months before making any other arrangements such as flowers, reception etc.

Anointing of the Sick is a sacrament of healing and comfort. Call the parish office as soon as someone becomes ill. Also, for chronic illnesses, this sacrament is offered twice a year. Watch the bulletin or call the parish office 815-653-2561 for more information.

Chaplet of Divine Mercy

The Chaplet of Mercy is recited using ordinary rosary beads of 5 decades. At the National Shrine of Divine Mercy in Stockbridge, Massachusetts the Chaplet is preceded by two opening prayers from the Diary of Saint Faustina and followed by a closing prayer.

Optional Opening Prayers

† You expired, Jesus, but the source of life gushed forth for souls, and the ocean of mercy opened up for the whole world. O Fount of Life, unfathomable Divine Mercy, envelop the whole world and empty Yourself out upon us.

† O Blood and Water, which gushed forth from the Heart of Jesus as a fountain of Mercy for us, I trust in You!

Begin with the Our Father, the Hail Mary and the Apostle's Creed: *The Apostle's Creed*

I believe in God, the Father Almighty, Creator of Heaven and earth; and in Jesus Christ, His only Son, Our Lord, Who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified; died, and was buried. He descended into Hell; the third day He arose again from the dead; He ascended into Heaven, and is seated at the right hand of God, the Father Almighty; from thence He shall come to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

On the large bead before each decade pray:

Eternal Father, I offer you the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity, of Your Dearly Beloved Son, Our Lord, Jesus Christ, in atonement for our sins and those of the whole world.

On the ten small beads of each decade, pray:

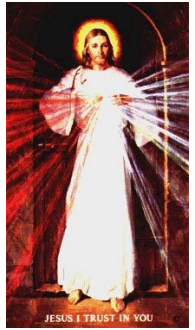
For the sake of His sorrowful Passion, have mercy on us and on the whole world.

Conclude with (Say 3 Times):

Holy God, Holy Mighty One, Holy Immortal One, have mercy on us and on the whole world.

Optional Closing Prayer

Eternal God, in whom mercy is endless and the treasury of compassion inexhaustible, look kindly upon us and increase Your mercy in us, that in difficult moments we might not despair nor become despondent, but with great confidence submit ourselves to Your holy will, which is Love and Mercy itself.
