## POINTS TO PONDER

From our Pastor—Fr. Sabo

### *We are witnesses of these things.*

*St. Luke, 24:46*

Today most provinces of Holy Mother Church celebrate the Solemnity of **the Ascension of Our Lord** (the Second Glorious Mystery of the Rosary) into heaven, body and soul. In the sixth article of the creed we profess every Sunday: *He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of God the Father Almighty.* Therefore, Christ awaits us in heaven and despite the difficulties associated with this world; *we seek the city which is to come, a changeless home, where we may live forever.* The Ascension strengthens and nourishes our hope of attaining heaven. Also, it invites us to lift up our hearts and seek the things that are above. St. Paul presents a great guideline for those of us interested in growing more God-like: *May the eyes of your hearts be enlightened, that you may know what is the hope that belongs to His call, what are the riches of glory in His inheritance among the holy ones, and what is the surpassing greatness of His power for us who believe* (Ephesians 1:18). ***We are witnesses of these things.***

Christ, the “New Adam,” reverses the curse associated with the sin of Adam, *opening the gates of heaven for the souls of the just which in the moment of death are free from all guilt of sin and punishment for sin* (De Fide).

Thus, the essential bliss of heaven awaiting the just consists in the immediate vision of God (*the beatific vision*) and in the perfect love of God associated with it. The Ascension reminds us: Heaven is associated with a Person, a place, and perfection of being, to be experienced by the redeemed, both body and soul. St. Leo the Great asserted on this glorious feast: *Today we are not only made possessors of Paradise but with Christ we have ascended, mystically but also really, to the highest Heavens and have won through Christ a grace more wonderful than the one we had lost.* Christ, by rising from the dead, restores not only our relationships with our family here on earth, but our heavenly relationships with all the countless Angels, Confessors, Martyrs, Saints, and Virgins! ***We are witnesses of these things.***

The truth of the Ascension should strengthen and nourish our hope of attaining heaven. Also, it invites us to lift up our hearts and seek the things that are above. Like the Apostles, we fight the temptation to become partly perplexed and partly saddened at His departure. Nevertheless, while He has returned to glory in heaven, His Sacred Presence remains in every Tabernacle, Monstrance and Holy Sacrifice of the Mass throughout the world, until time breathes forth unto eternity. St. Thomas Aquinas explains that *it was inappropriate for Christ to remain on earth after the Resurrection, whereas it was appropriate that He should ascend into heaven, because although His risen body was already a glorified one, it now receives an increase in glory due to the dignity of the place to which He ascends* (III, q.57 a 1).

While Christ awaits us in heaven, we must witness, to the unbelieving world, His surpassing power, greater than any steroid, stock, scientific discovery or superstitious claim, thus becoming a blessing for those yet to experience the blessings from above. *Men of Galilee, why are you standing there looking at the sky?*

*This Jesus who has been taken from you into heaven will return in the same way as you have seen him going into heaven* (Acts, 1:11). The angels speak not only to the witnesses of the Ascension, but to all ages, reminding us that the time is ripe for realizing the task set before us: *with our hearts sprinkled clean from an evil conscience and our bodies washed in pure water.* Thus the “Super Apostle” St. Paul encourages us: *Let us hold unwaveringly to our confession that gives us hope, for he who made the promise is trustworthy* (Hebrews, 10:23). The Lord is counting on our fidelity to daily duties, like praying our Morning Offering and Family Rosary, and perseverance in putting into practice holy habits, like grace before meals, avoiding the near occasion of sin and our act of contrition before going to bed, so as to remain pleasing in the sight of our Blessed Lord. Thus, Christ invites us to lift up our hearts and seek the things that are above, that: *We may have the joy of experiencing that He is also with us until the end of time, according to His promise.* ***We are witnesses of these things.***

The Ascension is our cause for continuous joy, as well as complete communion with Christ and His Body, the Church. This leads the faithful to respond gratefully to the gift of Him who through His humanity constantly pours Divine Life into the members of His Body. Therefore, in this Holy Eucharist, we pray that everyone has the joy of experiencing Christ Jesus with us to the end of time, according to His promise. Since Christ has blessed us with His Eucharistic Presence, may we put His life-saving message into practice asking ourselves daily: **How will I witness to these things,** thus safeguarding my citizenship in Heaven?

*O Mary, Queen of the Most Holy Rosary, pray for us!*

### Have You Made YOUR Pledge Yet? Diocesan Stewardship Program

Last weekend we distributed envelopes to make your annual Diocesan Stewardship pledge. We are trying a different process for Stewardship this year. You will not receive a pledge card in the mail as in the past. For several weeks we will make pledge envelopes available in the benches and on the magazine rack in the main entry of church. You may drop your pledge in the regular collection for the next three weeks. Then in June we will mail only to those families who have not yet pledged.

We are hoping, that through this different approach we will meet our target and not have to make up the difference from regular operating funds. We have 470 families on record. Our history shows that from year to year we have approximately 130 pledging families (28% of the parish). Statistics show that if 40% of our people were to complete a pledge we would make our goal and have extra funds to use for parish projects.

To accommodate the changing circumstances in families, experience has taught that we need at least 110% in pledges (\$32,528) if we are to make our goal and complete our diocesan obligation.

We ask each family to pledge 1% of their income, to this campaign. For example:

Household Income	1% Pledge	10 mo. pmt.
\$15,000	\$150	\$15.00
\$25,000	\$250	\$25.00
\$40,000	\$400	\$40.00
\$50,000	\$500	\$50.00
\$70,000	\$700	\$70.00
