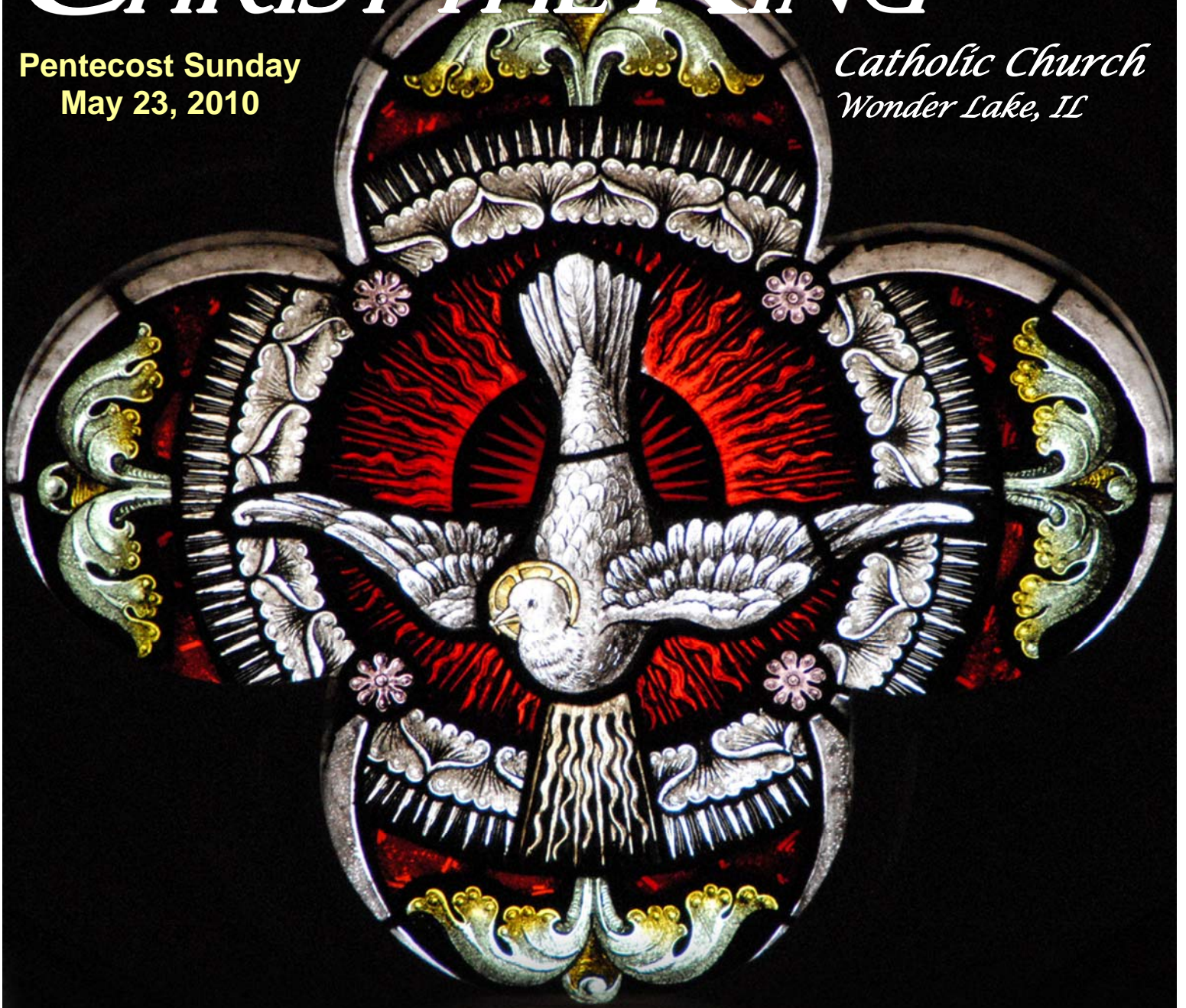

## POINTS TO PONDER

From our Pastor—Fr. Sabo

*Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and kindle in them the fire of Your love.*

How many science fiction fans over the years have enjoyed the Star Wars Trilogy: watching good triumph over evil? While it took three episodes for Luke Skywalker to discover the power of *the force* as a trained Jedi Knight, all confirmed Catholics possess within their souls a greater power than the so-called *force*. Thus many bishops reminded us, on the day of our confirmation, that we are *soldiers for Christ*. Where do we find a solution to every pain, pressure and problem facing us here on earth? As indicated in the opening prayer for the Mass on Pentecost Sunday: *God our Father, let the Spirit You sent on Your Church to begin the teaching of the Gospel continue to work in the world through the hearts of all who believe*. Without the Death, Resurrection and Ascension of our Blessed Lord into heaven, there would be no sending forth of the power of the Holy Spirit for the sake of sanctifying, strengthening, and safeguarding every soldier of Christ. ***Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of Your faithful and kindle in them the fire of Your love.***

Today we celebrate **the Solemnity of Pentecost** which commemorates the Descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles, fifty days after the Resurrection of Christ, as well as **the Birthday of the Church**. Pentecost reminds us that the Holy Spirit is the

perfect remedy for every pain, pressure and problem facing us pilgrims here on earth. The Father and Son's gift of the Holy Spirit is our spiritual solution to every struggle. *On the last and greatest day of the feast, Jesus stood up and exclaimed, **Let anyone who thirsts come to me and drink**. Scripture says: Rivers of living water will flow from within him who believes in me (John, 7:37-39)*. We live in a culture that claims to be able to quench our thirst, but the various bottles and brands being offered us, all fail to fill our hearts or satisfy our souls. Thus, St. Paul tells us: *The love of God has been poured into our hearts by his Spirit living in us, Alleluia (Romans, 5:5, 8:11)*. **Come, Holy Spirit, fill our hearts with the fire of your love!**

What makes the power of Pentecost personally present for any prudent pilgrim? Bishop Fulton J. Sheen stated: *Jesus' atoning death was the condition of receiving the Spirit of God. If He did not go away, that is to say, unless He died, nothing would be done; the Jews would remain as they were, the heathens would remain in their blindness, and all would be under sin and death. The return of His human nature in glory to heaven was a necessary preliminary to the mission of the Spirit. His going would not be a loss but a gain*. By sending forth the power of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles, the disciples, and the Blessed Virgin Mary, His influence would radiate outward making it possible to *renew the face of the earth*. **Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of Your faithful and kindle in them the fire of Your love.**

While those in the science community are convinced that the answer to every pain, pressure and problem can be experienced through prescription drugs, Jesus is prescribing the perfect solution: a happiness found within for those on fire with love of Him: God, the Holy Spirit! In the words of St. John Vianney: *Those who love the Holy Ghost experience every kind of happiness within themselves*. What are

we waiting for? Take the first step today, by surrendering your struggles over to the Divine power of the Holy Spirit! *Let anyone who thirsts come to me and drink*. Since Pentecost marks the birthday of the Church, we celebrate not by lighting birthday candles, but praying that the Holy Spirit enkindle in our hearts the fire of His Divine Love. Thus we become more heroic witnesses to the truth about the Catholic Church, the Universal Sacrament of Salvation. **Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of the faithful and kindle in them the fire of Your love.**

If we want to find a perfect solution to every pain, problem and pressure facing us here on earth: consider seeking a daily dose of God, the Holy Ghost. This gift is granted to any person who pursues a greater friendship with the Holy Spirit, who alone is capable of satisfying our thirst! By preferring His powerful presence in our heart and soul, we receive the grace needed *to renew the face of the earth!* Since *Mary is the short-cut to Jesus* (St. Jose Marie Escriva), our friendship with the Blessed Virgin Mary will surely help us to favor the fire of God's love! While faith makes it possible for us to prefer the gift of the Holy Spirit, Mary, our *model of faith* is a practical example of how the Holy Spirit *continues to work in the world through the hearts of all who believe* (opening prayer). Consequently, St. Louis Marie de Montfort in his book, *True Devotion to Mary* has stated: *Our blessed Mother is the perfect mold, wherein we are able to be molded in order to make her intentions and dispositions ours, especially her profound humility, her lively faith, her surpassing purity, and her divine wisdom*. Thus, we shall make it our aim to surrender every struggle over to the power of God's love and pray each and every day: **Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of Your faithful and kindle in them the fire of Your love.**

*O Mary, Mother of the Church, pray for us!*

### Have You Made YOUR Pledge Yet? Diocesan Stewardship Program

Please be sure to complete an envelope available on the table in the center aisle at the back of church. We are trying a different process for Stewardship this year. You will not receive a pledge card in the mail as in the past. For several weeks we will make pledge envelopes available near the main entry of church. Once completed, you may drop your pledge in the regular collection for the next two weeks. Then in June we will mail only to those families who have not yet pledged.

We are hoping, that through this different approach we will meet our target through the generosity of our most loyal attendees and get our "buffer" funds through the mail campaign. We have 470 families on record. Our history shows that from year to year we have approximately 130 pledging families (28% of the parish). Statistics show that if 40% of our people were to complete a pledge we would make our goal and have extra funds to use for parish projects.

To accommodate the changing circumstances in families, experience has taught that we need at least 110% in pledges (\$32,528) if we are to make our goal and complete our diocesan obligation.

We ask each family to pledge 1% of their income, to this campaign. For example:

Household Income	1% Pledge	10 mo. pmt.
\$15,000	\$150	\$15.00
\$25,000	\$250	\$25.00
\$40,000	\$400	\$40.00
\$50,000	\$500	\$50.00
\$70,000	\$700	\$70.00

**1st Confession-1st Holy Communion or Confirmation:** Contact Father Sabo at the Parish Office 815-653-2561.

**Marriage:** Preparation for Catholic wedding ceremony in the Diocese of Rockford takes place in steps over a period of at least 6 months. Therefore, meet with Father Sabo at least 6 months before making any other arrangements such as flowers, reception etc.
