POINTS TO PONDER

From our Pastor—Fr. Sabo

The Most Holy Trinity: *O Lord, our God, how wonderful Your name in all the earth!* - Psalm 8

Where do we begin to discover the Divine blessings that come to us from the Most Blessed Trinity? Scripture tells us: *When I beheld Your heavens, the work of Your fingers, the moon and the stars which You set in place—what is man that You should be mindful of him, or the son of man that You should care for him?* (Psalm 8) Our greatest fortune is found in our Christian faith. In it we learn that God is not a solitary being. He is the eternal community of three Divine Persons: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Every society outside of God, whether angelic hierarchy or human beings, exists because of the Holy Trinity. Revelation tells us that there is in God a true Fatherhood that belongs to the First Person alone. From all eternity, the First Person has been generating the Son, who is not a mere attribute of God, but a distinct Divine Person. This is clear from the opening words of the Fourth Gospel: *In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God* (John 1:1). Proceeding from the Father and the Son is the Holy Spirit. As indicated in the *Catechism of the Catholic Church: The Trinity is One. We do not confess three Gods, but one God in three persons. The Divine Persons do not share the one divinity among themselves but each of them is God whole and entire (#253) The Divine Persons are really distinct from one another, in their relations of origin: It is the Father who generates, the Son who is begotten, and the Holy Spirit who proceeds* (IV Lateran Council, 1215).

It is the common teaching of the Church that God created angels (spiritual beings

without bodies) and human beings (possessing both a body and an immortal soul). In the early thirteenth century, the Church had to formulate a Creed to defend the faith against the Albigenses, who claimed there were two gods. The good god created spiritual beings, while the evil god created the material world. The Lateran Creed declares: *We firmly believe and profess without qualification that there is only one true God . . . the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit . . . They are the one and only principle of all things - Creator of all things visible and invisible, spiritual and corporeal. By His almighty power from the very beginning of time, He created both orders of creatures in the same way out of nothing, the spiritual or angelic world and the corporeal or visible universe. And afterwards He formed the creature man, who in a way belongs to both orders, as he is composed of spirit and body. For the devil and other demons were created good by God according to their nature, but they made themselves evil by their own doing. As for man, his sin was at the prompting of the devil* (Fourth Lateran Council, 1215).

Since our faith is based on the belief in the Most Blessed Trinity, we baptize babies in the Name of the Father, of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. This ancient practice is based on our belief in *Original Sin* and its consequence upon the human race. If there were no such thing as original sin, we would blame all the problems in the world on a **bad gene pool** perhaps! However, as St. Paul educates us in the Second Reading: *the love of God has been poured out into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us* (Romans, 5:5). While the consequence of Adam's sin for humanity leads all to condemnation, *we have peace with God (the Father) through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have gained access by faith to this grace in which we stand, and we boast in hope of the glory of God* (Romans, 5:1). There was no major dissent from the biblical teaching about the fall of Adam until the rise of Pelagianism in the last part of the fourth century. Pelagius denied that Adam was endowed with the supernatural life of grace, which he lost for himself and his descendants by his sin of disobedience. To counteract this error, a series of Church councils were held. Not only was Pelagius condemned, but several popes confirmed the Catholic doctrine of original sin, stating: *Adam was the first man. He was created immortal. His bodily death was a punishment for sin* (Pope Zozimus I, 418).

Adam's sin was injurious not only to Adam, but also to his descendants. Moreover, it was not only the death of the body, which is punishment for sin, but sin, the death of the soul, that passed from one man to all the human race (Pope Boniface II, 531)

A thousand years later, the Protestant reformers resurrected the Pelagian heresy. As a result, the Council of Trent issued its famous Decree on Original Sin. Published in the same year (1546) that Martin Luther died, the Conciliar definitions spell out in the plainest language what the Catholic Church teaches on this fundamental mystery of our faith:

- Loss of Original Justice
The first man Adam immediately lost the justice and holiness in which he was constituted when he disobeyed the command of God in the Garden of Paradise.
- Death and Subjection to the Devil
Through the offense of this sin he incurred...the death with which God had previously threatened him and, together with death, bondage in the power...of the devil (Canon 1).

O Lord, our God, how wonderful Your name in all the earth (Psalm 8)! God's name is Father, Son and Holy Spirit or The Most Blessed Trinity, the Solemnity we celebrate in the Universal Church today! We are welcomed into the light, life and love of the Most Blessed Trinity on the day of our baptism. That first sacrament confers the merits of Christ: *Through the sacrament of baptism rightly conferred in the form of the Church, this merit of Christ is...applied to adults and infants alike* (Canon 3). As we shall later discover around the age of reason, baptism restores the supernatural life lost by Adam's sin. It does not restore the preternatural gifts but provides us with the promise of a glorified body on the last day, and a corresponding promise to possess all the graces we need to cope with our disorderly desires. Our natural powers of reason and free will remain weakened, but with God's grace, they are strengthened to enable us actually to become more holy through our struggles with concupiscence.

Thus, we pray in communion with our Blessed Mother, all the choirs of angels and Saints:

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, as it was in the beginning, is now and ever shall be, world without end. Amen.

St. Joan of Arc Archers—June 4th

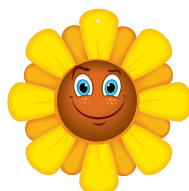

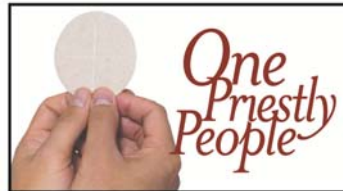
Have You Made YOUR Diocesan Stewardship Pledge Yet?

Please be sure to complete an envelope available on the table in the center aisle at the back of church. During the coming weeks we will be preparing a mailing to those who have not yet responded. Our history shows that from year to year we have had approximately 130 pledging families (28% of the parish). We would like to see at least 40% respond. Thus far we have heard from 50 families (11% of the parish). Those folks have pledged \$12,735 (43%) of our \$29,571 target. We ask each family to pledge 1% of their income, to this campaign. Baptisms take place by appointment. Meet with Father Sabo at least three months before making any other arrangements 815-653-2561

1st Confession-1st Holy Communion or Confirmation: Contact Father Sabo at the Parish Office 815-653-2561.

Marriage: Preparation for Catholic wedding ceremony in the Diocese of Rockford takes place in steps over a period of at least 6 months. Therefore, meet with Father Sabo at least 6 months before making any other arrangements such as flowers, reception etc.

Anointing of the Sick is a sacrament of healing and comfort. Call the parish office as soon as someone becomes ill. Also, for chronic illnesses, this sacrament is offered twice a year. Watch the bulletin or call the parish office 815-653-2561 for more information.

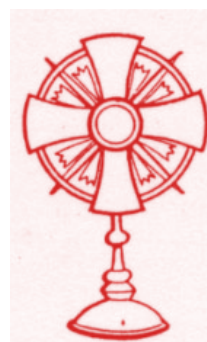
Word of Life
