POINTS TO PONDER

From our Pastor—Fr. Sabo

Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

This is my body which shall be given up for you; do this in remembrance of me. (1 Cor. 11:24-34)

Nothing is more essential than discovering Christ Jesus in the Holy Eucharist, thus *falling in love in a quite absolute and final way. What you are in love with, what seizes your imagination, will affect everything. It will decide what will get you out of bed in the morning, what you will do with your evenings, how you spend your weekends, what you read, who you know, what breaks your heart, and what amazes you with joy and gratitude. Therefore, fall in love, stay in love, and it will decide everything* (Fr. Pedro Arrupe, General of the Society of Jesus). Nothing is more essential than believing in Christ Jesus truly present in the Sacred Host.

For those of us who believe that Christ is truly present in the Holy Eucharist, no explanation is necessary, and for those who do not believe, no explanation is possible. Stated simply, belief in the Eucharist is a gift from God. Without the theological virtue of faith it is impossible to please God or to perceive the Holy Things of God, like the Sacred Priesthood and the foretaste of heaven that we receive regularly in the Holy Eucharist. ***What you are in love with, what seizes your imagination, will affect everything.***

The first words uttered by the priest after the consecration, remind us of the

three essential aspects of the Holy Eucharist, namely Presence, Sacrifice and Communion. Thus for many centuries the priest would pray after the consecration: *Father, we celebrate the memory of Christ your Son. We recall his passion, his resurrection from the dead, and his ascension into glory.* Fr. John Hardon, has reiterated what the saints lived and died for, namely that the greatest source of grace we have is the Holy Eucharist. *Faith tells us that Christ is really present in the Tabernacles; that Christ is really present on our altars at the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass and that Christ calls us to greater Communion with Him.* This means that those who attend the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass and receive Communion worthily, without mortal sin on their souls, obtain *His divine light and the strength that no one else has a claim to.*

Consequently, today's solemnity celebrates that perfect sacrifice offered at Calvary for the atonement of sins by Christ Jesus our Lord, truly present in the Sacred Host. Thus on the night before our Lord suffered and died for our salvation, He instituted both the Sacred Priesthood and the Holy Eucharist. Holy Thursday properly speaking is the unique celebration for those called by God to be Ministers of Word and Sacrament, as St. Paul so beautifully stated: *stewards of the mysteries of God.* Today's Solemnity is a unique celebration for all the faithful who profess their belief in Christ Jesus, truly present in the Sacred Host. ***What you are in love with, what seizes your imagination, will affect everything.***

A decree issued by Pope St. Pius X in 1906 declared: ***the primary purpose of the Holy Eucharist is not that the Sacrament may serve as a reward for virtue, but that the faithful, being united to God by Holy Communion, may thence derive strength to resist sinful desires, to cleanse themselves from daily faults, and to avoid those serious sins to which human frailty is liable.***

According to St. Basil: *Jesus instituted the Eucharist so that: eating His Body and drinking His Blood, we would always remember Him who died and rose again for us.* For those of us

blessed with a Eucharistic Faith, there is no other gift acceptable to offer Christ than love itself.

I recently had an encounter with a woman who left the Church because the priest at her parish failed to connect with the children. But don't you miss the Holy Eucharist? She responded: *no it's just a symbol.* It is dangerous to doubt the True Presence, because Jesus said: *Unless you eat my body and drink my blood, you have no life within you.* To doubt the True Presence is to doubt the divinity of Jesus Christ. The Eucharist is defined as: *that Sacrament, in which Christ, under the forms of bread and wine, is truly present, with His Body and Blood, in order to offer Himself in an unbloody manner to the Heavenly Father, and to give Himself to the faithful as nourishment for their souls (De Fide, Trent).*

St. Thomas also taught: *the sublimity of the Eucharist over all other Sacraments, since the Holy Eucharist, unlike the other Sacraments, is not merely an instrument of Christ's grace, but contains within it Christ, the Source of Grace Himself. For I myself have received from the Lord, that the Lord Jesus, on the night in which he was betrayed, took bread, and giving thanks broke, and said, **This is my body which shall be given up for you; do this in remembrance of me.*** Nothing is more essential than discovering Christ, in the Holy Eucharist: as ***Presence, Sacrifice and Communion***, thus falling in love in a quite absolute and final way. ***What you are in love with, what seizes your imagination, will affect everything.***

As we prepare to receive Holy Communion may we pray for the purity and humility possessed by our Blessed Mother, developing the holy habit of confessing serious sins before receiving Holy Communion. **May the Heart of Jesus in the Most Blessed Sacrament be praised, adored and loved with grateful affection, at every moment, in all the tabernacles of the world, even to the end of time.**

Mary, Mother of the Eucharist, pray for us!

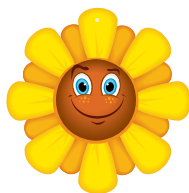

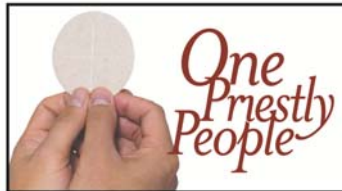

Have You Made YOUR Diocesan Stewardship Pledge Yet?

Please be sure to complete an envelope available on the table in the center aisle at the back of church. During the coming weeks we will be preparing a mailing to those who have not yet responded. Our history shows that from year to year we have had approximately 130 pledging families (28% of the parish). We would like to see at least 40% respond. Thus far we have heard from 64 families (14% of the parish). Those folks have pledged \$15,235 (51%) of our \$29,571 target. We ask each family to pledge 1% of their income, to this campaign. For example:

Marriage: Preparation for Catholic wedding ceremony in the Diocese of Rockford takes place in steps over a period of at least 6 months. Therefore, meet with Father Sabo at least 6 months before making any other arrangements such as flowers, reception etc.

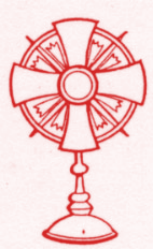
Word of Life
