POINTS TO PONDER

From our Pastor—Fr. Sabo

Happy Father's Day:

to our earthly fathers, our spiritual fathers and God our Father!!!

For whoever wishes to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake will save it.—St. Luke 9:24

*I would like to tell you something you will not hear on the television, something you will not hear on the radio and something you will not hear on the street corner: **there is nothing grander than doing the will of God, the Father.** Today we honor all of our fathers: God the Father, our domestic or earthly fathers and our spiritual fathers. One of the greatest crises facing the Church and Christian civilization is the *Crisis of Fatherhood*. Among us believers, we often quote wise people and one of the most popular in the Midwest is of course Yogi Berra. Yogi said: **You can learn a lot from observing.** In families, there is a crisis of fatherhood. In the priesthood, there is a crisis of fatherhood. With regard to the Sacrament of Matrimony, the court houses tell us the nature of the problem: fifty-percent of couples that say "I do" eventually say "I don't." Therefore, we are faced with answering the critical question: "Why?"*

The Wall Street Journal reports that the Association of Divorce Lawyers knows the number one reason why couples file for divorce today. Is it due to infidelity, alcohol, bankruptcy, boredom or the stress of children? The answer is "No." The Association of Divorce Lawyers tells us that 2/3 of cases filed in Court Houses state on their applications for divorce that it is due to pornography. Fifty percent of

marriages today end in divorce. Is there something wrong with the Sacrament of marriage? I am here to tell you: ***Of course not!***

What about the second crisis involving the priesthood? I will not presume to know the answer to this question, but as they used to say in the seminary, *if they don't pray, they don't stay.* Heaven forbid, they stay but fail to pray. What are the statistics? Out of 50,000 priests in the United States, approximately 300 are behind bars. Is there something wrong with the Sacrament of Holy Orders? Again, I say: ***Of course not!***

St. Alphonsus De Liguori, was famous for stating: ***the best of men are priests and the worst of men are priests.*** Why? I asked this question to a group of 6th and 8th graders when I was the Assistant Vocation Director and one young man responded: ***it is because some priests pray and others do not.*** So what is the solution to our fatherhood crisis? Whether a father of a family or a parish: **prayer is needed**—try the Divine Mercy Chaplet daily for your family! Pope JPII, was asked by one journalist what was the greatest thing that his dad ever taught him. Without hesitation, he responded: *that manliness and prayerfulness are not opposites.* The question facing all of us here today is how can I help the crisis of fatherhood in the world today? Part of the solution is found in our Opening Prayer: ***Let sin never ensnare us with empty promises of passing joy. Make us one with you always, so that our joy may be holy, and our love may give life.***

What is expected of those men who God may be calling to make the daily transition from manhood to fatherhood? There are three requirements, but the pre-requisite is captured in St. Paul's letter to the Galatians: ***For all of you who were baptized into Christ have clothed yourselves with Christ*** (Galatians 3:27). St. Luke also reminds us that: ***if anyone wishes to come after me, he must deny himself and take up his cross daily and follow me*** (9:23). The transition from manhood to fatherhood is made possible, by first becoming **a servant**, putting the needs of others before our own, believing that by giving everything, we receive everything. Thus, we gain so much more than we give up, thanks to the grace of God! This is confirmed by the holy hymn: *Thus will I bless you while I live...As with the riches of a banquet shall my soul be satisfied...My soul clings to you; your right hand upholds me—Psalm 63.*

Secondly, by becoming **a shepherd** and "a man after God's own heart, not afraid to

go to battle for the sake of those entrusted to our care. Thirdly, and most importantly, those men God is calling to make the daily transition from manhood to fatherhood must not be afraid of **sacrifice**, thus making their manhood more meaningful with the sacrificial offering of their lives for the greater benefit of their families or flock! Therefore, **the path to fatherhood must be paved with a daily commitment to being a shepherd, servant, and a sacrificial offering.**

Although we are unworthy of being associated with the Fatherhood of God, the real challenge facing the young men present here today is based on your willingness to answer the call to fatherhood, a call requiring courage, because: ***whoever loses his life for my sake will save it*** (St. Luke 9:24). May we never take for granted the truth that: if a man desires to be a servant, a shepherd and not afraid of sacrifice for the sake of those entrusted to his care, **then he is ready to be a father!** This is what the world needs most: manly men who persevere in prayer, with hearts of bronze for chastity, and a greater fidelity to the Fatherhood of God! Thus, we heed the words of wisdom spoken to a little Polish boy by his Father: *manliness and prayerfulness are not opposites.*

I would like to end with some excerpts from a letter I received on the occasion of my Priestly Ordination: *... It is my hope and prayer that as you begin your service to Christ's Church, you will choose to enter into His Passion. The first months are exciting and even a bit romantic. This romance, however will quickly fade away. What remains is the Cross of Christ. The Cross produces a deep spiritual satisfaction when embraced. I hope and pray that you will begin your service by choosing to embrace His Cross. This should be your only satisfaction. Many...choose to take their satisfaction in the world and the pleasures it offers; I pray it will not be so with you. Today is the best day to commit yourself to lifelong fidelity to our Lord's Cross.*

May we all, especially those called to fatherhood, entrust our hearts to Our Lady's perfumed hands, as we pray: ***O Immaculate Heart of Mary, refuge of sinners, we beg of you by the infinite merits of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, and by the graces God has granted to you since your Immaculate Conception, the grace of never going astray again. Mother, keep us sinners, constantly bathed in the light of your Immaculate Heart. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.***

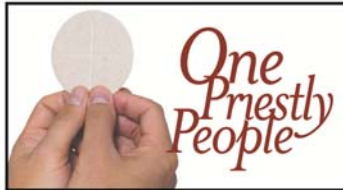


Gospel of John Evening Bible Study—June 22

Diocesan Stewardship Cards in the Mail

A mailing has been sent to all those who have not yet responded to our Annual Diocesan Stewardship Appeal. If you mailed your response to us during this past week, we thank you most sincerely and ask your understanding for the secondary mailing you might have received.

We are extremely grateful for the families that have already contributed so generously and responded so quickly.

However, we still had to request extra mailing supplies from the diocese because we needed to contact approximately 400 families. (The Diocese had provided us with materials for a 300 piece mailing, expecting that we would hear from 170 families by now.) We presently have \$19,360 pledged. We still need many pledges (\$10,211) to reach our goal and not take funds from our regular operating budget. We know this is a tight economy and that unemployment is high; so please, if you have a job and can donate \$5, \$10, \$20 or \$25 each month for the next 10 months, we truly need your pledge!

In the Hospital?

If you or a loved one are in the hospital, please call the parish office 815-653-2561 immediately. Due to privacy laws, the hospitals do not notify us when you are admitted. We want to visit those in the hospital, but need to hear from you.

Baptisms take place by appointment. Meet with Father Sabo at least three months before making any other arrangements 815-653-2561

1st Confession-1st Holy Communion or Confirmation: Contact Father Sabo at the Parish Office 815-653-2561.

Marriage: Preparation for Catholic wedding ceremony in the Diocese of Rockford takes place in steps over a period of at least 6 months. Therefore, meet with Father Sabo at least 6 months before making any other arrangements such as flowers, reception etc.

Anointing of the Sick is a sacrament of healing and comfort. Call the parish office as soon as someone becomes ill. Also, for chronic illnesses, this sacrament is offered twice a year. Watch the bulletin or call the parish office 815-653-2561 for more information.

Holy Orders: If you feel that God is calling you to begin the process of becoming a priest, contact Father Sabo at the parish office 815-653-2561.
