POINTS TO PONDER

From our Pastor—Fr. Sabo

Teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life? St. Luke 10:25

There is a potentially life-threatening social phenomenon called “bystander apathy,” and unless someone is picked out of the crowd, no one will come forward. To find a remedy for this unfortunate phenomenon, we need to examine the **scene**, **subjects** and **specialty** associated with the *Good Samaritan*, to discover the answer to the question: **who is my neighbor** (St. Luke, 10:30). The essence of today’s Gospel, illustrates how **he who loves not his brother whom he sees, cannot love God whom he does not see** (1 John, 4:20). *If only you would heed the voice of the Lord, your God, and keep his commandments; it is something very near to you, already in your mouths and in your hearts; you have only to carry it out; (Deut. 30:10-14)* so as to gain the gift of eternal life. The kind of love required for eternal life consists of three parts, namely the love of God, love of neighbor and love of self. There can be no salvation without self-giving love.

Blessed Cardinal Newman taught the principle referred to as the *convergence of knowledge, whereby to know (love) in your head is to experience it in your heart, so as to feel it in your body*. Even without feeling it, we possess the faith to know with certitude the priceless treasure of Christ’s life-saving love. To understand the *parable of the Good Samaritan*, three things are required: namely knowledge of the **scene**, **subject** and **specialty** associated with this hero who comes to the rescue.

The **scene** of the story is situated along a *notoriously dangerous* road from Jerusalem to Jericho. To understand the significance of this statement, we examine the facts: *Jerusalem is 2,300 feet above sea-level; the Dead Sea, near which Jericho stood, is 1,300 feet below sea-level. So*

then, in some what less than 20 miles, this road dropped 3,600 feet. It was a road of narrow, rocky terrain, and of sudden turnings which made it the happy hunting-ground of brigands (Barclay). Jesus was referring to something that commonly occurred along the road from Jerusalem to Jericho.

In order to avoid *bystander apathy*, we need to understand the parable of the Good Samaritan and learn from our Teacher the answer to the question: **what must we do to inherit eternal life?** *Besides the basic doctrine of loving God and your neighbor as yourself, this passage of the Gospel also includes another doctrine: namely that, the Law of God is not something negative, “do not do this,” but something positive, namely to love without limit (Navarre Biblical Commentary, #140).*

Secondly, let us study the **subjects** mentioned in the parable. First of all, there is the *man who fell victim to robbers, who they stripped, beat and left half-dead; along with a priest, who happened to be going down that road (chance or providence); a Levite, who passed by to the other side; and a Samaritan, a traveler who came upon him and was moved with compassion at the sight (St. Luke 10:30-33).* The Church Fathers tell us that this man represents the whole human race, wounded by sin and sucker punched by the devil, thus denied the immediate experience of true love, associated with the contemplation of the face of Christ. St. Augustine believed that *the man is taken for Adam himself, representing the race of man; Jerusalem, the place of peace and Jericho is interpreted to be the moon, and signifies our mortality, because it rises, increases, wanes, and sets. But in that Adam had sinned and death entered the world, our remedy is found in the righteousness of Christ, victorious over sin and death.*

By the priest the Law is signified, it had no power to save; and the Levite signified the Prophets and their knowledge, incapable of doing away with the consequences of sin. Why then did the priest pass by to the other side? The answer corresponds to the reality, that because the Law, only capable of condemning, was not able to cure or comprehend the mystery of Christ’s merciful love. At the sight of the victim of crime, the priest and Levite *pitied him, when they thought about him, but afterwards, overcome by selfishness, they went away again. For this is signified by the words, passed him by (Catena Aurea, St. Thomas Aquinas).* If only they would heed the voice of the Lord. It is something very near

to them, in their mouths and in their hearts. They failed to carry it out (Deut. 30:10ff).

But a Samaritan traveler who came upon him was moved with compassion at the sight. He poured oil and wine over his wounds and bandaged them; he put him on his own animal, took him to an inn, and cared for him (St. Luke 10:33-34). Instead of being a keeper of the worldly, the *Good Samaritan proves to be a keeper of the weak, wounded by sin, but nevertheless, more precious than gold (Ps. 19).* St. Gregory states: that *by the wine let the corrupt parts be washed, and in the oil experience the healing softness of mercy.* Also, *to be placed on his own animal is to believe in the incarnation of Christ (St. Augustine).* The inn represents the Church, who receives travelers, tired from their journey through the world, and oppressed by the weight of their sins, causing them to become “half-dead.” Thanks to the grace of the Sacraments, namely by coming clean with Christ in the confessional and with a worthy reception of Holy Communion, pilgrims receive strength for their struggles and healing for their sins. Most blessed indeed is the inn-keeper who is able to cure the wounds of another and blessed is the one to whom Jesus speaks, **if you spend more than what I have given you, I shall repay you on my way back. (St. Luke 10:35)**

The **specialty** of the *Good Samaritan* is his ability to put into practice the two greatest commandments, thus showing what we must do to inherit eternal life. There can be no salvation without sacrificial love. Recognizing our role as Good Samaritans, our Lord is not expecting us to become ATM machines for those in need, but EMTs capable of doing our daily good deeds, whether in word, prayer or deed. Thus, we understand that our neighbor is anybody in need, regardless of race, color or creed.

What must we do to inherit eternal life? (St. Luke 10:25) Listen and learn from the Good Samaritan, seeing in the sick and the suffering the face of Christ. Rather than, falling prey to bystander apathy, witness to Christ’s merciful love and work with all your strength to bring our neighbors closer to the Catholic Faith. As St. Benedict was so fond of saying, *treat all guests as if they were Christ*, and **return to the Lord, your God, with all your heart and all your soul**, and thus be assured of inheriting eternal life.

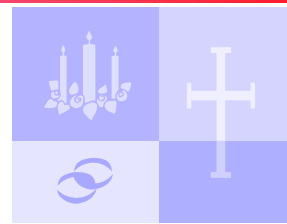

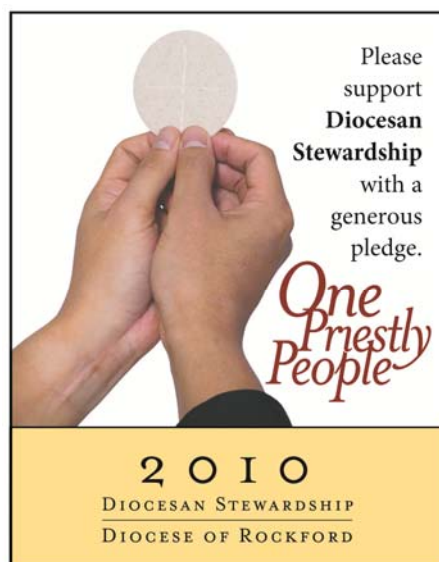
